After my husband passed away my oldest son asked me what I would be doing if money were no object. I did not hesitate to answer start a horse ministry to help kids. I have always had a heart for wanting to help children that are hurting. Almost 20 years ago I was listening to someone speak about a horse ministry and God whispered in my heart that's what I was going to do to help. It sounded pretty crazy and impossible to me so I quickly dismissed it. And then life steps in. Pain, regret, trauma, loss. We all face one of these at some point in life and I know all of them all too well, and they kept me stuck. Which is right where the enemy wants us. Trapped in a me focused life. It's so easy to let something go when you are faced with not knowing what to do.

Not knowing how to help someone you love can leave you with an empty void in your heart. Watching my youngest son walk through some very dark times in life was one of the most difficult things I have had to endure. He suffered through depression and anxiety which led to drug and alcohol use and many troubles with the law. Over two years ago he lost all hope. He felt there was nothing left to live for and that nothing could change his past. He took steps to take his own life. During this time, God was continuing to speak the ministry into my heart. My son survived his injuries for 10 months and after he passed away I knew I had to do something. I am thankful for the last months I had with him being able to read God's word to him and reminding him that none of us are beyond redemption in God's eyes. John 16:33 tells us "I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Please let this truth sink into your heart....even when things don't seem fair and life doesn't seem good, God is still working and God is still good!

It wasn't long after my son's passing that I was listening to Kim Meeder speak on the radio about her ministry at Crystal Peaks Youth Ranch and God again whispered in my heart that's what you're going to do to help. I knew there was a need and I knew there was something I was supposed to do. But pursuing my passion of helping kids and using horses to do it still seemed pretty impossible. I told God ok but there's only one problem, I don't have enough land or any horses. So someone is going to hand me the keys to their place and say here you go? I'm not sure if God's answer was "Oh ye of little faith" or "You have not because you ask not", but that's pretty much what happened.

Last year I was speaking to someone about the troubles a foster child was having and my mind immediately went to "that child needs Jesus and horses". While I was letting the hardships of life that I was walking through detour me down the wrong road, God was still right here waiting. If you're reading this and struggling with something, know this.....God will not leave you. Leave all of your sorrows and worries in His loving hands and He will walk you through it and redeem it into something beautiful. I don't feel very qualified for God to have called me to do this and I constantly ask "why me?". I'm learning that He typically doesn't answer the "why" questions so what He is teaching me is what He has always wanted me to know, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

I don't have it all figured out and honestly I still struggle, but I do have hope. Hope in the One who promises He is working all things to my good. We invite you to share in that hope with us. Walk in faith and obedience and give Him a willing heart and He will make a way!

Shorty is our sweet 19 year old Arabian gelding that was born on the farm. He adores children and adults alike. We will be using him for the ministry.

My heart sank, Shorty has never had colic before. I told Stephanie and we prayed together. My parents and Dr. Mike Douglas were diligent in his care over the next few days. On Thursday evening they thought they were going to have to put him down. He would get better and then worse. We shared his plight with others at Crystal Peaks and had them pray also. "God, you know we need him for this ministry. You have a plan for him. Please in your Son's name heal him, by the blood of Jesus." Over and over I prayed for those 4 days.

Friday morning it was grim he hadn't pooped or passed gas and it was very certain putting him down was going to happen. At the ranch that day we broke into small groups. We were supposed to be with another farm that had been doing ministry for a few years but plans changed. They were needed with the international ministries. We were grouped with a few other ministries and a couple of women that worked at the ranch. We decided to go around the room and pray for each person specifically. When it came my time of course I tearfully asked for prayers for Shorty and that our horses were being attacked since deciding to do the ministry. So those amazing women got to praying. One lady started praying and says "God, you are showing me the obstruction is in his backend. I ask you Lord through with your mighty power to heal that obstruction and make him poop and pass gas." It was an amazing time. Two minutes later my mom text me and said "he pooped". I have never been more excited to hear those words in all my life. I was able to share with the group and we could all praise The Great Healer for saving Shorty. I praise Him for loving us so much that He sent His only Son for us. To die and live again. He defeated death. We have no fear because of what Christ Jesus did. Let's quit worrying about the poop, God's got it, and get out there and share His insane LOVE for others!!!
